



Northeastern University and the City of Boston

Northeastern University has a long-standing commitment to the City of Boston, including Boston public high school students and graduates. Through community-based programs, admission, and financial aid initiatives, the university creates pathways to college and degree completion—a priority for Northeastern. **Northeastern University will waive the admission application fee for all applicants currently attending Boston public high schools.**

To apply, you must submit:

- › The Common Application found at **commonapp.org**, or the Coalition Application, available at **coalitionforcollegeaccess.org**.
- › Supporting documents, including transcripts and letters of recommendation. Please refer to **admissions.northeastern.edu/application-information** for specific requirements.

Northeastern must receive your complete application, including all supporting documentation, in order to make an admission decision. If English is your second language, you may also be required to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) exam, the International English Language Testing System (IELTS) exam, or the Pearson Test of English (PTE).

Application Deadlines

- › **Early Decision I:** November 1 (decisions released by January 1)
- › **Early Action:** November 1 (decisions released by February 15)
- › **Early Decision II:** January 1 (decisions released by March 1)
- › **Regular Decision:** January 1 (decisions released by April 1)
- › **Fall Transfer:** April 1 (decisions released by June 30)
- › **Spring Transfer:** October 1 (decisions released by December 15)

Students applying for financial aid should file their FAFSA and CSS Profile by the applicable priority filing deadline listed below.

- › For the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form, visit **studentaid.gov** and use the Northeastern University code **002199**.
- › For the CSS Profile, visit **cssprofile.collegeboard.org** and use the Northeastern University code **3667**.
- › Students eligible for federal financial aid who are considering applying Early Decision may request an early need-based financial aid review. Visit **admissions.northeastern.edu/early-decision-benefits** to learn more.

The Northeastern Promise

Northeastern is committed to meeting the full demonstrated financial need of students eligible for federal financial aid. We offer a full complement of financial aid, including grants and scholarships, to provide you with the means to take the next step toward your future. **The Northeastern Promise** enables you to plan for the entire cost of your degree.

- › Northeastern University scholarship and grant funds will not be reduced during your undergraduate program for up to eight in-class semesters.
- › Northeastern University's need-based grant funds will be increased annually at the same percentage rate as the increase in tuition.

- › If your family experiences a substantial negative change in financial circumstances, we will reevaluate your aid package and make all financial resources you qualify for available.

How to apply for scholarships

Northeastern does not require applicants to submit supplemental information to be considered for merit scholarships. Students must submit their admissions application and all supporting documents no later than our January 1 deadline to be considered for the awards below. The following scholarships specifically serve Boston residents and Boston public high school students.

The Boston Public High School Scholarship

High school seniors graduating from a Boston public high school who are in the top 10% of their graduating class are eligible for this scholarship. Each high school may nominate up to two candidates for the award. Additional candidates may also be identified through Northeastern's general application evaluation process. Applicants must have extensive engagement in their local school communities and a commitment to service within the city. If you believe you're a good candidate for this scholarship, please speak with your school counselor about the nomination process.

The Northeastern Boston Valedictorian Scholarship

Senior class valedictorians are eligible for the scholarship, with preference given to students from the designated 35 traditional district and exam Boston public high schools. Students must apply and be admitted as first-year students to Northeastern's undergraduate day program.

The Boston Housing Authority Scholarship

First-year undergraduates and transfer students are eligible. Candidates must be residents within a Boston Housing Authority public housing complex at the time of admission. Please note: Please note that a verification letter from the BHA is also required for your application.

A full scholarship covering tuition, housing, food, and fees is offered to a cohort of high-need, first-generation students.
